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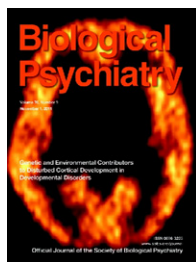

On the cover is a mean parametric map of binding potential (BP_{ND}) in 19 patients with obsessive-compulsive disorder from Figure 3 of Simpson *et al.*, pages 897-904 in this issue. For visual purposes, the cover image has been smoothed from the original quantitative image that appears in the paper. In that image, each square is a voxel on the parameter map with a mapping between the size of the parameter and the intensity of the voxel color. No voxels or clusters of voxels were significantly different between the patient group and the healthy control group.



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
