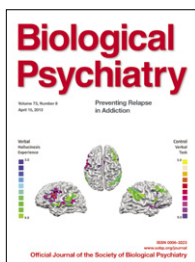

On the cover, Laprevote *et al.* (pages e13–e14, in this issue) show surface-rendered functional magnetic resonance imaging activations in a patient with alcohol-induced hallucinosi during auditory hallucinations and a control verbal task. The hallucinations are concomitant with activation of language-related brain areas with a reversed functional asymmetry.

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
